

## THE THIRD TREASURY AT ROSENBERG PALACE



Erik Møller Arkitekter have fitted out the Third Treasury in the northernmost half of the cellar at Rosenberg Castle, formerly a wine cellar.

The Treasury houses exhibition rooms for an extensive ivory, amber and weaponry collection that used to be inappropriately displayed elsewhere at the castle or stored in repositories.

Erik Møller Arkitekter have overseen the architectural restoration of the rooms and in association with Kvorning design & kommunikation the display cases and lighting were executed as special assignments.

In conjunction with the project an extensive alarm system was installed together with a climate control system in the showcases and rooms.

## ROSENBORG CASTLE



Rosenborg Castle, Christian IV's beloved country seat, built outside the ramparts of Copenhagen in 1606, was expanded, converted and extended over the next 250 years, leaving behind it a complex and comprehensive architectural history.

The castle, a museum piece in its own right, currently houses the Royal Danish Collections and is visited by 200,000 people annually.

For a number of years EMA has been looking after Rosenborg and adjoining buildings in Kongens Have (The King's Gardens), and has thus been instrumental in ensuring the continuity and quality of one of Denmark's finest castles.

The assignments include restoration of the castle's 18th-century Porter's Lodge, appointment of exhibition facilities in the basement of the Castle, restoration of the castle windows, and reinforcement of the Knights' Hall's partition flooring as well as renewal of its marble floor.

In addition, building inspections will be conducted with a view to maintenance and the generation of fresh ideas, and to plotting the future of the castle and its wings in financial terms.
